J. Fred Smithcors Student Veterinary History Essay Contest

Eligibility

- Students must be currently enrolled in an AVMA-accredited veterinary school.
- Students must be a citizen of the United States or Canada.
- Students may submit more than one essay each year but cannot be awarded more than one prize each year.
- Students who have submitted essays in previous years (and/or won a prize) continue to be eligible until graduation.

All participants receive a complimentary, one-year membership in AVMHS, which includes two issues of *Veterinary Heritage*, AVMHS's semi-annual journal.

Winning essays may be published in Veterinary Heritage, which also offers students a publication credit.

Submission Guidelines

- Manuscript pages should be numbered and double-spaced in 12-point Times Roman (or similar), including the reference list. Do not include your name or school on manuscript pages.
- Essays should be no more than 3,500 words (exclusive of graphic material and references).
- Essays must be original work, with accurately cited sources.
- Complete an entry form, available at https://avmhs.org/essay-contest
- Email PDFs of your entry form and essay, attached as separate files, to the Committee Chair by 5 June 2025 (midnight).
- Retain your original Word document for possible future publication in Veterinary Heritage.

Essay Evaluation Criteria

- Historical interest and relevancy
- Scientific merit
- Writing quality
- Research documentation and references

Suitable Topics

Essays should have a clear historical subject, be rigorously researched, and tell an interesting story. Only historical and veterinary topics will be considered. Examples include (but are not limited to):

- Development of treatments, diagnostic techniques, surgery, and/or research
- Diseases
- Biologicals or pharmaceuticals
- Instruments
- Species emphasis
- Public health issues
- Legislation
- Biographical information (deceased individuals only)
- Veterinary colleges and institutions
- Veterinary medicine in literature, art, or society
